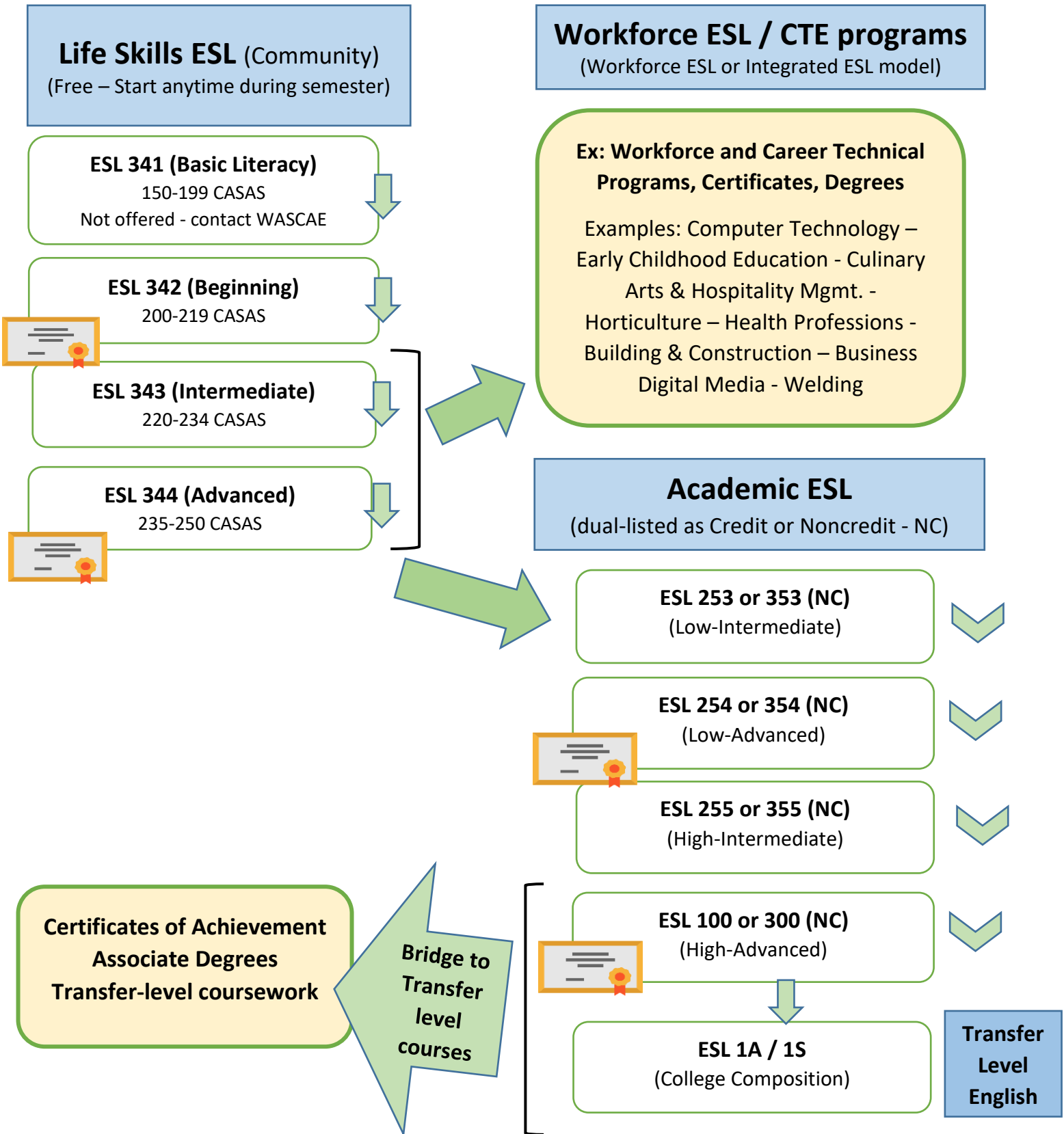


Cabrillo College English as a Second Language Course Recommendations

All students are eligible to take transfer level English College Composition (ENGL 1A or ESL 1A). If you are learning English as a Second Language, we have several classes to build your literacy and writing skills to help you achieve your educational goals. Please refer to the ESL guide to help you select the class the right for you to start. Classes are offered for FREE!



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### **ESL 341 Basic Literacy**

Emphasizes listening/speaking and reading/writing skills at a beginning level.



**Listening/Speaking:** Functions minimally, if at all, in English or with some difficulty in situations related to immediate needs. May communicate only through gestures and a few isolated words or basic learned phrases and sentences

**Reading/Writing:** May not be literate in any language or may read and write letters and numbers and a limited number of basic sight words and simple phrases related to immediate needs

### **ESL 342 Beginning**

Emphasizes listening/speaking and reading/writing skills at a beginning level.



**Listening/Speaking:** Student can satisfy basic survival needs and very routine social demands. Understands simple learned phrases easily and some new simple phrases containing familiar vocabulary

**Reading/Writing:** Can read and interpret simple material on familiar topics. Able to read and interpret simple directions, schedules, signs, maps, and menus. May write messages or notes related to basic needs.

### **ESL 343 Intermediate**

Emphasizes listening/speaking and reading/writing skills at an intermediate level.



**Listening/Speaking:** Can satisfy basic survival needs and social demands. Has some ability to understand and communicate on the telephone on familiar topics and participate in conversations on a variety of topics.

**Reading/Writing:** Can read and interpret simplified and some non-simplified materials on familiar topics. Can interpret simple charts, graphs, and labels; interpret a payroll stub; can complete a simple order form. May be able to write short personal notes and letters and make simple log entries.

### **ESL 344 Advanced**

Emphasizes listening/speaking and reading/writing skills at an intermediate level.



**Listening/Speaking:** Can function independently in survival and social and work situation; can clarify general meaning and communicate on the phone on familiar topics

**Reading/Writing:** Can read and interpret non-simplified materials on everyday subjects; can interpret routing charts, graphs, and labels; fill out medical information forms and job applications; and write an accident or incident report
