# Cabrillo can't stop Reedley

Cabrillo College's football team was thumped 58-7 by host Reedley College in a nonconference game played at Reedley High on Saturday night.

It was the most points Cabrillo has allowed in a game since a 62-8 thumping by host Sierra on Sept. 11, 2004. The Seahawks' nonconference slate continues Saturday, when it travels to Los Altos Hills to take on host Foothill [2-0], the No. 3 ranked team in NorCal and No. 4 in the state.

Reedley [1-2] entered the game winless, but it faced powers Foothill and San Mateo [1-1], No. 11 in NorCal and No. 21 in the state, previously.

Cabrillo [1-2] trailed Reedley 23-7 at the half after allowing two touchdown passes, two field goals and a safety.

The Seahawks' lone bright spot came with 11:51 left in the second quarter. Quarterback Jerry Alvarez connected with

receiver Jake Pruger for a 41-yard scoring pass to narrow the deficit to 12-7.

Matt Burke — who kicked a game-winning field as time expired in last week's win over Solano — kicked the extra point.

Alvarez finished 9 of 25 for 86 yards. The former Watsonville High standout was sacked five times, including twice by Marcus Dallas Jr., a 6-4, 230-pound freshman out of Georgia.

Reedley quarterback Michael Ferrara-Weed — a 6-foot-3, 220-pound freshman out of Florida — passed for a pair of touchdowns in the first half, connecting with receiver Lonnie Powell from 46 yards out and Jamel Turner from 22 yards out.

David Badikyan kicked field goals of 33 and 36 yards.

Reedley, located southeast of Fresno, is loaded with out-of-state players. Ferrara-Weed is one of 48 players out-of-state players on Tigers' 70-player roster.
