MPC tight end torches Cabrillo

Jackson puts Seahawks on board

MONTEREY — It was a tight end who torched the Cabrillo College football team.

Jake Davis ran free on a post route for a 70-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter. He broke a tackle and raced 68 yards for a score in the second quarter. And, he found the end zone once again in the third quarter, dragging a foot along the sideline to haul in a 3-yard toss.

Davis' three touchdown catches and 174 receiving yards were more than enough for Monterey Peninsula College to snag its fifth straight win. It beat visiting Cabrillo 35-10 on Saturday night in a Coast Conference South game.

MPC [5-2, 2-0 Coast Conference South] jumped out to a 28-0 halftime lead when quar-

terback David Fales threw three of his four touchdown passes before intermission. Fales finished 15-of-23 for 287 yards with four touchdown passes and no interceptions.

Cabrillo [2-5, 1-1] tried to climb back into the game in the third quarter. The

Seahawks scored 10 points in the first 7:26 of the period, but King City's Evan Umstead recovered a fumble at the 6-yard line, and his high school teammate Davis hauled in his third touchdown in the corner of the end zone just 30 seconds later to make it 35-10.

Dylan Jackson scored Cabrillo's lone touchdown on a slashing 31-yard run to make it 28-10. Jackson finished with 46 yards on 13 carries. The

MPC defense hounded Cabrillo throughout the night, giving up just 107 yards on the ground, and another 107 yards through the air.

"We got some big plays, and the defense did a great job creating some turnovers and really slowing them down," MPC coach Mike Rasmussen said. "That was a great effort by our defense."

Cabrillo next faces San Jose City College at 7 p.m. Oct. 29 in Aptos.
