Cabrillo bests Gavilan in regular-season finale

Seahawks overcome six turnovers

APTOS — The Cabrillo College football team overcame six turnovers to keep Coast Conference South rival Gavilan winless on the season with a 27-17 victory in both teams'

season finales Saturday night at Carl Conelly Stadium.

Cabrillo forced four turnovers on defense and held Gavilan quarterback Nate Ellis to only 51 yards passing and only allowing him to complete 7 of his 27 attempts.

The Seahawks [4-6 overall, 3-2 CCS] close out their 2011 campaign with back-to-back wins for the second straight year.

Cabrillo got a solid per-

formance from quarterback Brent Moyer, who threw for 197 yards and a touchdown on 12-of-17 passing. Moyer came in relief of starter Robert Concha-Foley early in the second quarter.

Fernando Olivarez fumbled a punt and Gavilan recovered on Cabrillo's 17-yard line.

The Rams scored on a Anthony Velasquez 20-yard field goal.

On the ensuing kickoff, Olivarez more than redeemed for the miscue on the punt, taking the kickoff 85 yards for a touchdown.

Olivarez also had a game-high 92 yards receiving on four catches, including a 37-yard touchdown. Running back Dylan Jackson ran for 93 yards on 12 carries in the victory.

Kicker Matt Burke con-

verted on all three of first half field goal attempts and the Seahawks went into halftime up 17-10 despite two huge turnovers on muffed punt returns.

Burke finished with four field goals in the game.

Gavilan (0-10, 0-6) got 71 yards rushing from Jakari Johnson,

including a 40-yard touchdown. Ellis added the Rams' second touchdown late in the fourth on a 7-yard score.
