Cabrillo volleyball wins 14th straight

The Cabrillo College women's volleyball team put the finishing touch on an incredible regular season with a 25-16, 20-25, 25-16, 25-15 rout of visiting Foothill on Wednesday that extended the Seahawks' winning streak to 14 matches.

Sierra Clarke and Brooke Carroll made it a stylish finale, setting Seahawks season-highs in three different categories. Clarke whacked 18 kills and posted nine blocks while Carroll amassed 50 assists.

Tori Bozzo finished with 16 kills, Clarke added seven digs, and Carroll had nine digs and three aces.

Cabrillo [26-1] will almost certainly earn a No. 1 seed heading into next week's Nor-Cal regional tournament. The Seahawks await the results of Sunday's seeding meeting in Stockton, which will determine their opponent in Tuesday's first round.

HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL

The Monterey High, Christopher and North Monterey County football programs were recommended to play in the upper division of the two-tiered Tri-County Athletic League beginning next season, according to the Monterey County Herald.

The recommendation is not official until the Board of Managers approves the decision, however. They are scheduled to meet on Dec. 6.

The three teams, each of whom played in the Monterey Bay League this season, are expected to be a part of the TCAL's upper division along with Palma, San Benito, Salinas and Gilroy.

The TCAL's lower division, meanwhile, is expected to include Monte Vista Christian School, Seaside, Watsonville and Pajaro Valley, along with Everett Alvarez, Alisal and North Salinas, according to the Herald.

The two-tiered equity league was agreed upon two years ago by athletic directors in both the TCAL and MBL in order to create

more balanced matchups.
